Approval of minutes from April 22nd, 2019: Brian Higgins made a motion to accept the April 22nd minutes as written and Scott Champagne seconded the motion. All were in favor of the motion.

Rosalind Page: Rosalind Page (Planning Board Chair) came before the board on behalf as the North Country Council Transportation Committee. Last month Rosalind attended a North Country Council Bike Plan Meeting in Lincoln where she met a lady who is working on a bike trail in which some of the trail would come through the town of Lisbon. The Cross New Hampshire Adventure Trail goes from NH to ME. Rosalind was asked to come before the board to see if this is something they would approve/ support. The roads the trail would run on are Bath Road then down School Street to Water Street and from Water Street to Bishop Road and then Lyman Road to Route 302. Rosalind stated that the Cross New Hampshire Adventure Trail has been awarded a Tillotson Fund Grant in the amount of \$13,620 which is to help with the signage, cartography and publicity of the trails. The board stated they are on board with this idea.

(Arthur Boutin arrived)

Update/Discussion on Riverside Market Bills: Scott Champagne (Chair) was given copies of the bills from Rebekah Dumont (owner) of Riverside Market in reference to the sewer back up that occurred about two weeks ago. The board reviewed the bills that were provided. The board is still waiting for the bill from Schofield Septic in reference to jetting the line. Some of the board members wanted to know what Rebekah's deductible is through her insurance company as well before a decision is made. They are hoping to have a decision by the next meeting.

Discussion on 166 S. Main Street (Sewer Issue): Over the weekend Scott Champagne (Chair) received a call from the Building Inspector (Chris Hodge) about a health hazard at 166 S. Main Street. He stated that there was raw sewage coming from the residence and running down the bank into the river. The building is owned by Peter Wojtul and there was a similar issue at the same place last year. Both the building inspector (Chris Hodge) and Chairman of the Board (Scott Champagne) had contacted the owner last year and gave him 10 days to correct the issue. Scott Champagne made a motion to send out a certified letter to Mr. Wojtul in reference to the sewage issue, once he receives the letter he will have 10 days from the receipt of the letter to correct the issue or a fine of \$50.00 a week will be applied until the issue is corrected. Brian Higgins seconded the motion. All were in favor of the motion.

Pemi-Baker Solid Waste- Annual Rate Adjustment: A letter came from North Country Environmental Services stating that effective May 1, 2019 the Pemi-Baker Cooperative prices at the NECS facility will increase by 1.69%. The new rates will be \$64.64 per ton for MSW; \$66.80 per ton for C&D and \$32.46 per cubic yard for Bulky Waste.

Final Water/Sewer for 33 Brummer Road: A final read was done for 33 Brummer Road in the amount of \$118.66. Scott Champagne made a motion to approve and sign and Arthur Boutin seconded the motion. All were in favor of the motion.

ATV Club Picnic Table Discussion: The board looked at where the picnic table will be placed by Sunoco and have decided that the ATV club

can take a chain and put it around the base of the tree that is on the property the town owns and then around the legs of the picnic table. They thought this was a better idea instead of seeing if highway could pound a post into the ground.

7:24 PM Scott Champagne made a motion to go into non-public in reference to a Buffington Fund Application and Personnel Issues and Brian Higgins seconded the motion. All were in favor of the motion.

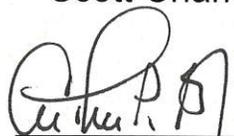
8:08 PM The board came out of non-public and Brian Higgins made a motion to adjourn and Arthur Boutin seconded the motion. All were in favor of the motion.

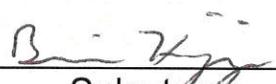
