Board of Selectmen's Meeting

Approval of minutes from May 31st BOS meeting and Public Hearing: Arthur Boutin made a motion to approve the minutes from the 5/31/2017 BOS meeting and Brian Higgins seconded the motion. All were in favor of the motion.

Meeting with Landaff and Lyman Select Boards in reference to Transfer Station stickers and review of the old Solid Waste/Recycling Ordinance dated 2009: A meeting was held with all three towns and it was decided upon that stickers be issued to residents of Lisbon, Lyman and Landaff at no charge. Residents will get a sticker when they register a new vehicle or renewing and don't have one. It was also decided that every 5 years the color of the stickers will change. After review of the Old Town of Lisbon Solid Waste/Recycling Ordinance some changes were made. One of the changes being that this ordinance was renamed to Tri-Town Solid Waste/Recycling Ordinance. Each town brought forth changes that they wanted to see and all the changes were agreed upon. The new Tri-Town Solid Waste/Recycling Ordinance was signed by all three towns. Errol Peters made a motion to approve the new Tri-Town Solid Waste/Recycling Ordinance and Jim Trudell seconded the motion. All were in favor of the motion.

Meeting with Landaff Select Board to go over Police Patrol

Coverage: Errol Peters stated that the town of Landaff is looking to get coverage for 4-5 hours a week. Roughly 20-25 hours a month. It was discussed that if an arrest needed to be made in Landaff then the court in which the case would be held would be in Haverhill. This being said it would cost the town of Landaff more money as Lisbon currently uses Littleton district court. Officer Pinson was present at the meeting and stated that he has already made some calls to see if it's possible to have the court changed if Lisbon starts patrolling in Landaff. Once Chief Pinson gets an answer back in reference to the jurisdiction issue he stated he would then draft up a proposal (something similar to how the solid waste/recycling ordinance was done) and present it to the boards. Basically it will be contracted services which Landaff is ok with. Errol Peter's thinks that once people start noticing that there police presence it will hopefully deter suspicious activity. Chief Pinson stated that once an agreement was made that an article be put in the media letting the public know that police will begin patrolling Landaff. Again the boards are waiting for Chief Pinson to get some answers before they move forward.

Abatements Water/Sewer: Gregory Decker from 160 Highland Ave came before the board. He stated that he bought the house in November of 2016 and he was up for a day moving stuff in and wasn't able to get back up here until December. When he arrived back at 160 Highland Ave and opened the door to find out that the pipes had burst and water had been running which flooded his house. He was asking the board for a little forgiveness. The board has agreed to help him however they wanted to check with Chris Hicks to see what the norm is for this address. The board informed Mr. Decker that once they got the information they needed they would be in touch with him about his abatement.

Town Clerk-Ref Properties that have not paid taxes beyond Three Years: Jenny presented the board with 14 properties that were reviewed for tax deeding.

Update from Department Head meeting held on 6-2-2017 along with budget reviews: It appears as though each department's budget looks ok. **Jenny** will be getting a new printer and her old printer can be brought to the RR Station for the board to use.

Highway- They will be leasing a new dump truck. They are going to take the \$106,000 from the capitol reserve and use it as a down payment on the truck which will then be leased for 7 years. They don't expect to see the truck until September-October. It was brought to attention that the sidewalk on the bridge has some big holes in it that need to be repaired. Kevin stated that he will be working on the repairs this week (weather permitting)

Chief Pinson- had a few line items in question but was able get print outs for the specific lines and he had some purchases from 2016 that were taken out on 2017. This will be brought to our financial advisor Greg Colby's attention.


