Letter for Road Ban: A letter was sent to the board from Tom Demers in reference to going over the weight limit on class 4, 5 and 6 roads when posted. Mr. Demers claims that this is a hardship for his business. A request as such seems to be unusual. Arthur Boutin made a motion to deny and Brian Higgins seconded the motion. All were in favor of the motion.

Bid on old Ambulance: The town of Warren NH offered a bid on the old "A2" 2002 Ford Ambulance of \$5,500. The buyers are aware of all the issues with the vehicle. David Combs agrees to the sale of this ambulance. The bill of sale needs to state "As is". Arthur Boutin made a motion to sell for \$5,500 and Brian Higgins seconded the motion. All were in favor of the motion.

Letter from Deb de Santos: Deb sent the board a letter asking that she be appointed a position on the ZBA if there was an opening. A motion was made to appoint her and all were in favor.

Pilot Program: A request has come in for a new solar garden off Northey Road. It appears that in the past a prior contract for a solar garden near Evergreen was signed by Steve Knox. It has been decided that this needs some further research.

Water Tanks: A revised contract was dropped off and all the proper certificates were provided in reference to cleaning the tanks. The board agreed to sign the contract and see where it goes.

TA Hiring Committee: The TA hiring committee has run an ad and they will accept resumes until May 26, 2017. They will then chose a few candidates and interview them and then present them to the board.

Letter to be sent: Letter will be sent to Lindsay and Craig Meyers in reference to a grant that had been requested.

Property: Jean Mardin had called the town office and required about some property (used to be Pickens). Arthur Boutin made a motion to sell for at least \$5,000 and Brian Higgins seconded the motion. All were in favor of the motion.
