1) The board reviewed the minutes of the September 8, 2106 meeting

Motion by PN to approve, 2<sup>nd</sup> by SB – All voted in favor, none opposed

2) Capital Improvement plan update:

Dan Updated the board on the current status, and is planning to present additional information during the November meeting.

## 3) Master Plan update:

Dan reviewed the survey results. He stated that he had additional work to complete tabulating the data. - 4) Reviewed the proposed amendments to the Subdivision Regulations dated 10/13/16. Section 5.15 was amended to read "boundry markers shall be 5/8" diameter metal pipe/rod, at least two feet long located in the ground at final grade level, and indicated on the final plat. Boundry markers on road frontage shall be in concrete".
  - Motion by PN to adopt as amended, second by BA, all voted in favor.
- 5) Continuation of Site Plan Review Regulations Public Hearing:

Discussion took place as to what impact these draft changed may have had on recent plans submitted to the board.

RP had agreed to look into a recently approved plan;

Dollar General – The parking matched the draft regulation (the quantity had been reduced from the old regs), and per the draft, there would be about 50% more green space require in the front with additional trees.

The board identified no changes that they would like to make. RP will contact both Tara Bamford (North Country Council) & Dan to see if we can be ready for a public hearing on November 11.
